£5,000 Funding Extended



The £5,000 cash discount offered as a financial incentive to buy EVs has been extended until 2017.

The government scheme offers 25% off of the cost of purchasing an Electric Vehicle, up to a maximum of £5000.

At least £200 million is available to finance this incentive which is designed to encourage more people to consider driving EVs.

Extended Range EVs



Two leading EV manufacturers have announced plans for new, extended range models from 2017. The BMW i5 is expected to have a 300km range. It should be launched next year as a 2017 model.
